I would like to thank our School Board for their support this year. We are lucky to have a committed group of people who have learners at the heart of their decisions and are future focused. At the end of this year our Presiding Member, Bob White, will be stepping down from the Board. I would like to sincerely thank Bob for his dedication to CMS over the past 9 years. We have been very fortunate to have had someone with his expertise and educational background supporting our school.

On Wednesday 22 November we held our Whānau Hui. This was a great opportunity to celebrate the achievement of our ākonga Māori, the kapa haka rōpu, and to seek feedback from our Māori whānau. Whaea Kahurangi has done an outstanding job this year supporting staff in Te Ao Māori to upskill and gain confidence in themselves as teachers. She has also supported many additional groups for ākonga to learn additional te reo Māori, and of course her expertise has seen our kapa haka reach a standard for all to be proud of. Over 100 whānau were treated to a passionate performance from our kapa haka rōpu, followed by the presentation of our Māori leader awards and presentation of taonga. This is the first time we have presented these awards at the hui and it was so nice to be able to recognise the achievements in front of a large group of whānau. The recipients this year for most improved were Taj M and Ruby M, and kapa haka excellence were awarded to Ngarimu W and Amaria P.

We also sought feedback from whānau around what we are currently doing well as a school, things we can improve on, and ideas on what we could add. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive with some great celebrations of what CMS is doing well in terms of honouring Te Tiriti o Waitangi and bringing Te Ao Māori to life. We gathered great ideas of things we could add in such as a wharenuī to our front entrance, more opportunities for kapa haka/extension classes for Te Reo Māori, more leadership opportunities and awards for ākonga Māori.

We are excited for a number of initiatives moving into 2024. We will be focusing the professional development of staff in the areas of English and Mathematics to support a structured approach to literacy and numeracy. We have also almost completed the tender stage for our new specialist classes. This is going to be an exciting and innovative space that will be an asset to the CMS community and will enhance the learning experience for students.

To our families who have their final child moving on to begin their next stage at secondary school, we thank you for your support of CMS during your time here and we look forward to seeing all of our new and current families next year.


